PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Family and Christ.

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! Last weekend we were unable to print the bulletins, so I decided to copy my bulletin article for this weekend as well because some of you may not have been able to get the bulletin online. I thought it was too good to not get printed!!!

As you know about every month or so since October, we have been doing a little catechesis on Eucharistic miracles. I want to thank Megan Ourso for continuing to do that for me the last several months. Of course, this is in response to the U.S. bishops' three-year effort to renew the faithful's devotion to the Holy Eucharist (we also continue with our book study on Thursday evenings at 6:30PM on "The Seven Secrets of the Eucharist").

This coming summer will end the second year of the Eucharistic Revival. Thousands of people are expected to participate in a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage beginning from each corner of the country and ending in Indianapolis for the **National Eucharistic Congress July 17–24**. The third and final year, following the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress, will be dedicated to the Church "going out on mission" to renew the world.

As we begin this month of March, I want to introduce you to a unique Eucharistic miracle. Several months ago, a parishioner E-mailed me an article about a unique occurrence that happened while Pope St. John Paul II was visiting the United States in 1995. He had had a full day's schedule in Baltimore. The day was ending with a quick stop at a major U.S. seminary called Mount Saint Mary's. To save time, the plan was that he would just greet the seminarians outside on the steps, but this saintly Pope wanted to first visit the Blessed Sacrament in the Chapel.

Upon learning his request, the security detailed jumped into action. They began sweeping the Chapel with specially trained dogs that could easily locate persons that may be hiding behind walls or pews. These dogs are highly intelligent and are usually trained to locate survivors in the collapse of buildings after earthquakes and other disasters.

This is a quote from an eyewitness of what happened next when the dogs approached the Tabernacle: "Upon reaching the Tabernacle, the dogs sniffed, whined, pointed, and refused to leave, their attention riveted on the Tabernacle, until called by their handlers. They were convinced that they discovered someone there. We Catholics know they were right — they found a real, living Person in the Tabernacle!"



How cool is that! These highly intelligent and well-trained dogs were able to point out the living presence of the Blessed Sacrament without even knowing what they were doing! In my estimate, this is a Eucharistic miracle like none other! Below is a link to a YouTube video explaining this occurrence in more detail.

May we continue to grow in greater Eucharistic devotion during this season of Lent!



REFLECT

On March 25, 2020, the Church celebrated the 25th anniversary of the papal encyclical Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life). This prophetic document, written by Pope St. John Paul II, reaffirmed the Church's constant teaching on the value and inviolability of every human life.

The Gospel of Life highlights the special and particular role of women in bearing the gift of life. St. John Paul II offers heartfelt thanks to "heroic mothers," who, placing their trust in God, "devote themselves to their own family without reserve, who suffer in giving birth to their children and who are ready to make any effort, to face any sacrifice, in order to pass on to them the best of themselves" (EV 86). The Holy Father also outlines many challenges that expectant mothers may face, recognizing that an "unborn child is totally entrusted to the protection and care of the woman carrying him or her in the womb" (EV 58). For this reason, it is particularly important that the Church come alongside mothers, offering encouragement, assistance, and support that is life-affirming for both them and their children.
