PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE By Father Paul Gros

Dear family in Christ,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! It is good to return home from my week vacation in Colorado. If you were able to see pictures on social media or in last weekend's bulletin, you can just image how beautiful the scenery was in Southwest Colorado. Riding a bike through the mountains, far from any trailhead, makes it even more exhilarating. But I came back refreshed and ready to jump back into ministry... Yes, with a few bumps and bruises, but through the intercession of my guardian angel (who I invoke every time I ride) all in one piece!!!

As the deacons mentioned last weekend in the homily, for the next four weekends, the Church has paused from Mark's Gospel in this Year B and taken a small detour through the Gospel of St. John chapter 6, which is known as the Bread of Life Discourse. It is in this Gospel passage that the church relies heavily in her Eucharistic theology. As I have preached on numerous times, the Eucharist is the true presence of Jesus Christ - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in what looks like bread and wine. The Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks of the Eucharist as "the Source and the Summit" of the Christian life. In other words, it is a Source from which all graces flow because it is the presence of Jesus in our midst, and it is the Summit by which we are heading towards as we ascend the mountain of faith on our lives' Pilgrimage to full communion with Jesus one day in heaven.

I am reminded of one of the bike climbs that I did on my vacation that was a 30-mile ride. About 8 miles was uphill and at some points very steep. I had to make several stops to catch my breath and rest. But getting to the top was amazing - seeing the wildflowers and God's creation that surrounded (see the pics on the back cover of the bulletin). The beauty was so "out of this world" that I can see why some of the saints used "ascending a mountain" as an analogy to the Christian life. It is challenging fighting against the temptations of the flesh, the world, and the devil (like ascending a mountain), but once we are at the top (heaven) all the struggles of the ascent will not matter any longer, while the beauty and joy of being in communion with God, who is Love, will far surpass the efforts we made in this world to grow in holiness.

Finally, I felt moved knowing that the church will be reading from the Bread of Life Discourse for the next several weekends and that she just concluded a grace-filled Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN this past July 17–21 in which over 50,000 of the faithful were in attendance, including Bishop Duca and many from the Diocese of Baton Rouge, to speak out against the blasphemous opening ceremony of the 2024 Olympics in Paris, France. What we see on display is classic spiritual warfare, where the church is trying to bring revival and renewal to faithful devotion to her holiest treasure in the Eucharist, Satan and his minions are mocking it in a way that seems unprecedented for our day. If you do not know what I am speaking about, just look up "opening ceremony for the 2024 Olympics and mockery of the Last Supper" on an internet search engine.

Blasphemy, which is to act or speak against God in a sacrilegious way, is by far one of the worst sins of pride. It is certainly no coincidence that within 24 hours Paris, known as the "City of Lights", underwent a blackout in which the entire city was in darkness, except for one building - the Basilica of Sacré-Coeur (The Sacred Heart), which the Eucharist has been in perpetual adoration for the last 135 years! Is God trying to say something?

How shall we respond? Certainly, through prayer, adoration and making acts of reparation particularly to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Holy Face of Jesus for the sins directly against God. I plan to speak more about this in my homily for this weekend! Boycotting the games may be something else you feel called to do.

REFLECT

In Evangelium vitae, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that, "A mother welcomes and carries in herself another human being, enabling it to grow inside her, giving it room, respecting it in its otherness" (EV 99). Often the first and most basic way that a mother welcomes and cares for her child is by attending to her own health. In doing so, she ultimately contributes to the wellbeing of her child, as the health of mother and child are inextricably connected. After her child is born, a mother's devoted care continues as she nurtures this new life and attends to her child's every need.

As healthcare costs continue to rise, obtaining access to adequate medical care can be challenging, particularly for single women in poverty. According to 2014 statistics, 75 percent of women who chose abortion were low income. The financial strain of medical care can often place significant burdens on both pregnant and parenting mothers. Data from 2016 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention revealed that 15 percent of women in the United States received inadequate prenatal care. As we walk with mothers in need, we pray that our efforts will help mothers and their children gain access to quality, life-affirming medical care and address this fundamental need.

- Give up sleeping on your pillow one night. Offer this small sacrifice for mothers and children who have difficulty accessing adequate medical care.
