PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE By Father Paul Gros

Dear Parish Family,

It is very appropriate that we celebrate this Feast of the Most Holy Family this weekend within the Octave (8 days) of Christmas. Why? Because it was the Newborn King that was the "glue" that held Mary and Joseph together in the "thick and thins" of what life was dealing them at the time.

It can be quite easy to dramatize the Christmas story as being all "nice and neat." However, it was certainly not that at all. Image having to endure 100 miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem riding on a donkey (and being 9 months pregnant!). When you arrive in Bethlehem there is no place to stay but a stable for animals. There you give birth to your 1st born child. Though support comes with the visit of the shepherds and Magi, because King Herod has decided to murder all the young boys under the age of 2 years old in the town of Bethlehem, soon you must travel to the unknown land of Egypt where you will most likely be treated as a stranger and outsider.

I can image those uncertainties and difficulties would put stress on a marriage. Please do not think Mary and Joseph had it easy. They did not! Yet it was the One between Joseph and Mary that held them together. As their eyes laid fixed on Him, their trust grew in God providing for them and supporting them. How important it is for couples to pray together! How important it is for couples to go to Mass together! How important it is for couples to fix their eyes on this Newborn King to get them through the difficulties of life!

Like Mary and Joseph's journey to Egypt, once a couple makes that unbreakable commitment to one another in the covenant of marriage, it can be a journey of much uncertainty. Pope Francis once said:

"Those who celebrate the sacrament [of marriage] say to one another, 'I promise to be true to you, in joy and in sadness, in sickness and in health; I will love you and honor you all the days of my life.' <u>At that moment, the couple does not know what will happen, nor what joys and pains await them</u>. They are setting out, like Mary and Joseph, on a journey together. And that is what marriage is! Setting out and walking together, hand in hand, putting yourselves in the Lord's powerful hands. Hand in hand, always and for the rest of your lives. Do not pay attention to this makeshift culture, which can shatter our lives."

Do not pay attention to this makeshift culture! But rather, pay attention to the Holy Family who inspires us, who challenges us and who prays for us!
