Dear Parish Family



Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! You may have noticed something a little bit different on the altar the past several weekends. What you are looking at is a chalice veil and burse. This is a practice that is encouraged but not required for Mass. In the General Instruction for the Roman Missal (the instructions on how to celebrate Mass) it states, "It is a praiseworthy practice for the chalice to be covered with a veil, which may be either of the color of the day or white" (GIRM 118). This liturgical garment was introduced in the Middle Ages and had both a practical use and a liturgical/theological meaning. The practical use was to keep the dust and insects from the sacred vessels and the host that was to be consecrated. The theological meaning is far more significant and goes back to the Book of Exodus in which God instructed Moses to build the Tabernacle (tent) for the Ark of Covenant (Exodus 35-40). The room that contained the Ark was called the Holy of Holies and was veiled from the outside. This veil was embroidered with the stars and angels to emulate the heavens. Hundreds of years later in 966 BC, King Solomon completed building the Temple in Jerusalem, which was patterned off of the Tabernacle that Moses built in the desert. It too had a Holy of Holies at the very top of the Temple which housed the Ark of Covenant. This Holy of Holies was also veiled with a much larger, but similar, veil.

When Jesus died on the cross, St. Matthew tells us in his Gospel that the veil was torn from top to bottom - And Jesus cried again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit. And behold, <u>the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom</u> (Matthew 27:50). This torn curtain, or veil, at the death of Jesus signified the transition from the Old Covenant to the consummation of the New Covenant promised by Jesus at the Last Supper: "And likewise He took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:20).

The removal of the chalice veil in the liturgy signifies the transition from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the "heavenly liturgy." Despite the barrier of our unworthiness, the unveiling of the chalice invites us to enter into the celebration of the sacred mysteries. When the veil is removed, the splendor of the chalice is exposed.

So next time you are at Mass, as the deacon removes the veil, be reminded that we are now entering into the TRUE Holy of Holies, which is the heavenly liturgy. Here we join our own hearts to the heart of Jesus as the Holy Spirit makes present that one true sacrifice, which is the sacrifice of the cross, and Jesus offers Himself along with us to the Father.

#### REFLECT

In Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life), Pope John Paul II applauds the daily heroism of mothers who selflessly devote themselves to their children. This modern-day saint also highlights the unfortunate reality that "these heroic women do not always find support in the world around them." He goes on to say, "On the contrary, the cultural models frequently promoted and broadcast by the media do not encourage motherhood. In the name of progress and modernity the values of fidelity, chastity, sacrifice, to which a host of Christian wives and mothers have borne and continue to bear outstanding witness, are presented as obsolete" (EV 86).

A culture that fails to truly value motherhood naturally becomes hostile to the gift of new life. When the Church compassionately serves mothers, it witnesses to the beauty of human life. There is a great need for real, tangible assistance for expectant mothers. Christ calls us to serve those most alone and in need.
