# PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Parish family,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ this last weekend of the Christmas Season! Once you read this bulletin article, I will be on the tail end of my silent retreat this week. I promise I have prayed for you and all your intentions. I felt moved to give a little theology on the use of incense at Mass because I used it a good bit during the Christmas Season.

**Incense at Mass** – What in the world is father doing?!?! Priests often joke with each other that most Catholics either love it or hate it. I must admit, there seems to be somewhat of a friendly competition amongst some priests as to how smokey they can get the sanctuary. And I know some of my brother priests have even mischievously not put incense in the thurible – the vessel used to burn the incense – at the beginning of Mass just to see if people would cough merely at the sight of it!!! I promise I would never do that do you.

Certainly, making the sanctuary as smokey as possible is not the point. There is a theological reason it is used at the Mass that goes all the way back to Old Testament times. As we read the beginning of the Gospel of the Luke when the Angel Gabriel visited Zechariah to announce the coming birth of the John the Baptist, Zachariah was chosen by lot as a Levitical priest to burn the incense offering in the holy place of the Temple. This was a very honorable offering to make as it was the closes a priest could get to the holy of the holies where the ark of the covenant was held and where only the high priest could enter once a year to offer the Sacrifice of Atonement. What was the significance of the incense offering for the Jews in the Temple and now for us at Mass? The smoke symbolizes the prayers of the faithful drifting up to heaven. In Psalm 141, the Psalmist prays, "Let my prayer come like incense before you; the lifting up of my hands, like the evening sacrifice". In the New Testament times (our times), incense also creates the ambiance of heaven: The Book of Revelation describes the heavenly worship as follows: "Another angel came in holding a censer of gold. He took his place at the altar of incense and was given large amounts of incense to deposit on the altar of gold in front of the throne, together with the prayers of all God's holy ones. From the angel's hand, the smoke of the incense went up before God, and with it the prayers of God's people. (Rev. 8:3-4)"

Finally, incense can be used to sanctify as holy water would be used. If you notice during the Mass, the crucifix is incensed along with the nativity scene (for Christmas) or Easter candle (for Easter). The priest is also incensed, along with the congregation themselves. All this is to symbolize the sanctification of the object or person, especially as they are now offering themselves to God the Father through Jesus Christ at each sacrifice of the Holy Mass (recall that the Mass is the re-presentation of the Lord Jesus' crucifixion offered to the Father made present to us each time we attend).

In the end, the usage of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth and allow us to enter the presence of God. Incense is not something that I use every Mass. However, it is something that the Church makes optional for any Sunday. Because I do not always have altar servers who are able and trained to use it (or tall enough) it is not always possible. And I want to "highlight" the solemn Masses we celebrate. Especially Masses for Holy Days like Marian Feast Days and Solemn Feast Days like Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, Corpus Christi, Holy Trinity, and Christ the King. Adding the incense seems to be an appropriate option for the Mass being celebrated to point to the solemnity.
