# PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Parish Family,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ as we begin this Jubilee year of 2025. Back in May 2024 Pope Francis declared in a document entitled "Hope Does Not Disappoint" that this coming year would be a year of jubilee for the Church. Britannica.com described a Catholic jubilee year as "a celebration that is observed for one full year every 25 years, during which Catholics may be granted remission of sins (in the form of an indulgence) by the pope under certain conditions, such as completing a pilgrimage." The last jubilee year that was declared was an extraordinary jubilee year in 2016 for the "Year of Mercy" and before that was in 2000 when Pope St. John Paul II declared a jubilee year for the new millennium.

This year the jubilee year is a "Year of Hope." Pope Francis wrote in his document in May: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

Jubilee years go all the way back to ancient Biblical time in which every 50 years the Israelites would celebrate a year of "rest" and "emancipation". Leviticus 25:10 states: *This fiftieth year you shall make sacred by proclaiming liberty in the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, when every one of you shall return to his own property, everyone to his own family estate.*" During this year, debts were forgiven, slaves were freed, and land was returned to its original owners. It was a time that God wanted Israel to recall that they had been once slaves and had been freed by God through Moses. That same mercy was to be shown to others as He had shown to them.

The Catholic Church picked up this tradition in 1300 AD when Pope Boniface VIII declared the first Christian jubilee, granting full remission of sin for those who confessed their sins and made a pilgrimage to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Today a plenary indulgence is attached to certain stipulations that are conducted by the faithful during the Jubilee Year. The Holy See issued a decree on May 13, 2024, outlining the ways that Catholics can obtain a plenary indulgence during the 2025 Jubilee Year. "A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day..." (Diocese of Baton Rouge Year of Jubilee of Hope plenary indulgences)

These stipulations include a pious visit to a sacred place. In our diocese several churches have been named "sacred places" including St. Joseph Cathedral and Mater Dolorosa in Independence. A pious visit includes spending a "suitable" amount of time during a prayerful visit in Eucharistic adoration, either in exposition or before the tabernacle, meditation, and concluding with praying for the intentions of Pope Francis, the recitation of the Our Father, any legitimate form of the Creed, and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary. (Diocese of Baton Rouge Year of Jubilee of Hope plenary indulgences).
