## PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Parish Family,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! This 4th Sunday in Holy Lent you may notice something a little bit different in what Father and the deacons are wearing - the rose-colored vestments. Why the rose vestments? Because this Sunday is called Laetare Sunday or "rejoice" Sunday. It is a day of hopeful anticipation, a break from the more somber tone of Lent in which we wear violet (a color that represents penance), as the Church reminds the faithful that Easter draws near three Sundays from now. The rose-colored vestments are a more festive color than the violet, but not as festive as white or gold. Laetare Sunday reminds us that we are a little more than halfway through the season of Lent as we journey to Jerusalem with Jesus toward His passion, death, and resurrection.

#### Veiling the Statues

Next weekend I have decided to bring back another tradition in the Church - the covering of statues in the church. This tradition dates back many years in the Church but was lost in the 1970's, though it has a deep symbolic meaning. The tradition was reinstated by the United States Bishops in 2001 and was made an optional practice for the Church.

So, what is the significance? First, after Laetare Sunday, it heightens the anticipation of the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. We live in a world that is "veiled" from the fullness of truth and is under "the shadow of death." Just like Jesus' humanity and crucifixion "veiled" the glory of His divinity, we, too, veil the images in the Church to emulate the coming passion and "darkness of the tomb."

It is at the Easter Vigil that these images are unveiled because it is the resurrection that "unveils" the mystery of death and the hope of life after this world. In other words, when images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we are able to see our true home. Christ "lifts the veil," so to speak, through His Resurrection!

Next, this period of Lent is particularly focused on the Passion of Christ. During this time, the Church encourages a deeper focus on the liturgical readings and prayers. Veiling the statues is a form of "sensory deprivation" that facilitates a greater focus on the solemnity of Christ's suffering and sacrifice, while also drawing attention away from other images in the Church.

Finally, during this time we hear passages in John's Gospel particularly where Jesus is speaking openly about His divinity and He being the Son of God. In John 8:59, the Jews want to stone Him because of this, but "Jesus hid Himself, and went forth out of the temple." The veiling of the statues is to emulate Jesus hiding Himself until His time has come to be glorified by the Father (John 12:23).

So, next week be prepared to see the statues veiled!!! As we approach Holy Week, please know of my prayers!


