PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Parish Family.

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! This Sunday's second reading delves into one of **St. Paul's recurring themes** in his letters: **the old and new creation**. "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God." Of course, St. Paul is not speaking about taking our last physical breath on Earth. Instead, he is referring to a spiritual death to the "old creation"—the created yet fallen world that is subject to sin, disorder, suffering, decay, and ultimately, physical death. St. Paul beckons his readers to "put to death the earthly parts"—that is, the old creation marked by lust, greed, passion, anger, lying, malice, deceit, etc.

Why? Because, through baptism, you have died to the old self and have "put on a new self" (a new creation). Though we have not yet grasped this new creation in its fullness until Christ appears ("When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory"), St. Paul exhorts us to live now accordingly!

As I was reading the second reading this Sunday, I was reminded of an old fable that beautifully describes the battle that goes on within us between the old and the new:

An elder is teaching a young person about life. He says, "A fight is going on inside me, a terrible fight between two wolves.

"One wolf represents evil—he is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, selfpity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego.

"The other wolf represents good-he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith.

"This same fight is going on inside you, and inside every other person too."

The young person thinks about it for a moment and then asks, "Which wolf will win?"

The elder simply replies, "The one you feed."

The one you feed! Do not feed the old creation, otherwise it may grow stronger and stronger, leading us to destruction. Instead, starve it to death ("Put to death the parts that are earthly...") through fasting, prayers, penance, and the sacraments of the Church. This is the way to holiness, the way to "putting to death the old self," and the way to living according to the new creation that was given to us when we died with Christ in baptism!
