Dear Parish Family,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

On this 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the second reading the Church gives us begins with St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians. This letter was addressed to the Christian community in Colossae, a city in modern-day Turkey. He wrote this letter from Rome while in prison, likely between 60 – 62 AD, around the same time he wrote the letters to the Ephesians and Philemon.

One of the major themes of the letter was St. Paul combating a multifaceted heresy often called the "Colossian heresy." Scholars speculate that one of the problems with this heresy was that it diminished the unique role and supremacy of Jesus Christ. With this in mind, we can see that St. Paul is adamant about Jesus' supremacy in the opening lines of this Sunday's reading:

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God... For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth... all things were created through him and for him.

To really stop and think deeply about this line should lead our hearts to great awe and reverence. For ALL things were created FOR Him! From the smallest speck of dust to the most glorious of angels, ALL things are FOR the Lord Jesus Christ!

St. Paul goes on to say, "He is before all things, and in him all things hold together." This is another line that speaks deeply of His supremacy and divine omnipotence. All things are held together in Him. In other words, nothing would continue in existence without the Lord holding it there! Finally, St. Paul makes another bold statement: "For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him." So, we see that Christ Jesus is both the beginning and the end, the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last! (Rev. 22:13). To say that Jesus Christ is supreme is an understatement based on what St. Paul says in these beautiful lines.

So, what can we take away from the first few lines of Colossians? We can look for Jesus in EVERYTHING, we can find Jesus in EVERYTHING, we can place our trust in Jesus in EVERYTHING, and we can surrender to Jesus in EVERYTHING. Never underestimate our Lord's divine supremacy in EVERYTHING!
