Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ! I have good news for us this month of July! We will be getting seminarian Austin Duhé as part of his summer assignment. He will begin here on July 11th. Below is a small autobiography he wrote for you all. I look forward to serving with Austin the rest of this summer!

Originally born in Reserve, LA, I was baptized at St. Joan of Arc in Laplace and moved to St. Amant when I was just three years old. I've lived in St. Amant ever since, graduating from St. Amant High School in 2018. I was steadily growing in my Catholic faith as a teenager, going to Steubenville Youth Conferences every year, but I confess that I was not the most perfect young man growing up! I also had the privilege of being spiritually nurtured by Fr. Josh Johnson while he was pastor of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary in St. Amant, seeing him as a unique role model and spiritual father. Thoughts of becoming a priest never crossed my mind during high school, and so I enrolled at River Parishes Community College (RPCC). I had a desire to help others, but at the time I didn't know what that could look like. I developed an interest in the law field during high school, and so I decided to major in Criminal Justice. However, after two years, those career desires didn't come to fruition.

Instead, a desire welled up within me to learn about the Catholic faith that I was baptized into as a child. I began finding meaningful answers to questions about my Catholic faith that were left unanswered in my formative teenage years, and I also took Mass, Confession, and Prayer more seriously compared to years past. It was during this time that thoughts of the priesthood came to mind, but I always dismissed those thoughts. With my desire for holiness maturing, my desire for Criminal Justice took its "nail in the coffin" during the pandemic, and so I dropped out of college and got hired with my best friend at Stanley Steemer, not really knowing my next step forward in life. It was at this time that I would work to please customers in their own homes and felt very good about myself meeting new people and getting to know them. It seemed that while I was working this job that not only did I love the Lord and not only did I find myself in Eucharistic Adoration every morning before going to work, but I also began to see Jesus in my customers and found that my original desire to help others was being fulfilled. It felt like a pastoral experience, and so priesthood became an increasingly comfortable vocation to consider.

Through much prayer and guidance from Fr. Josh Johnson, continued encouragement from family and friends, I was accepted as a seminarian for the Diocese of Baton Rouge in August of 2021, and it's the best decision I've ever made in my life thus far. I now find myself entering my fifth year of priestly formation and my first year at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. I'm so grateful for the people I've met along the way, and I can't wait to get to know you all. God bless!

REFLECT

While we often think of pregnancy as culminating in the birth of child, we know that the journey is only just beginning. While motherhood brings with it many joys and blessings, it also involves challenges and difficulties. In raising their children and dedicating themselves to their families, mothers participate in a type of "daily heroism," one for which they "do not always find support in the world around them" (EV 86). Providing and caring for children as a single mother includes additional hardships. Sadly, today, one in four children are being raised without a father. Certainly, there are many reasons this might occur in any given circumstance. However, it is also true that in a culture that largely rejects the Church's teachings on marriage, life, and sexuality, women and their children are often disproportionately impacted. It was Pope Paul VI in Humanae vitae who warned that, "a man who grows accustomed to the use of contraceptive methods may forget the reverence due to a woman... no longer considering her as his partner whom he should surround with care and affection" (HV 17).

In the midst of this reality, the Church is called to be a beacon of light, hope, and support. May we respond to this call, individually and communally, to surround mothers with assistance and support as they lovingly care for their children.

ACT (choose one)

- Saints Anne and Joachim—whose feast is celebrated on July 26—were the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parents often seek the intercession of these married saints as they raise their own children. Offer this prayer (bit.ly/annejoachim), asking Saints Anne and Joachim to pray for the featured intention.
- Fast from television, social media, music, or electronics altogether for one day. Ask the Lord to use the quiet and stillness to bring you more closely to Him.
- Offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for the featured intention.
