PONDERINGS OF THE PEDAL-N-PADRE

Dear Parish Family,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ on this **last weekend** of the Liturgical Year! The Church always celebrates the Solemnity of **Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe** (commonly called Christ the King) on this weekend!

In his encyclical entitled *Quas Primas*, Pope Pius XI addressed the ever-growing rise of secularism that was encroaching in popular culture following WWI. His desire was to reassert Christ Jesus as **King of the Universe** (over individuals, families, and societies) to combat the anti-clerical and anti-Christian ideologies that were eroding the moral fabric of society. It was also a response to the atheistic communist regimes in Eastern Europe that replaced God with the state. Oh, how much we need this Solemnity today!

In the Gospel this weekend, we read from Luke 23:35–43, which is a scene from the crucifixion. We read that the Romans placed a sign (titulus crucis) which was inscribed with the phrase, "This is the King of the Jews." We know from John's Gospel that it was written in Latin, Hebrew, and Greek. This is very significant to us today, not because we speak those languages, but because all three of those languages are used in our Mass, which is a re-presentation of the sacrifice of the cross. The Kyrie Eleison at the beginning of Mass is Greek; "amen," "alleluia," and "hosanna" are all Hebrew words. Latin, of course, is the language of the Church and, contrary to popular opinion, the use of Latin was not prohibited in the Liturgy by Vatican II after the changes in the Mass. In fact, the first document produced by the Council Fathers (bishops of the Council) was Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. It addressed the use of Latin in the liturgy with a nuanced approach.

Sacrosanctum Concilium stated: "The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites" (SC 36 n1). This statement clearly indicates the Church's intention to maintain some Latin within the Roman Rite, while at the same time allowing for more use of the vernacular language (in our case, English) within the liturgy. One of the emphases the Council Fathers wanted to highlight was the faithful's "active participation" in the Mass. This primarily meant their active participation in joining their hearts to the heart of Christ in the Holy Sacrifice made present to them at every Mass. But it also included the greater use of Scripture in the Liturgy (understood by the faithful in their native tongue) and the dialogue parts of the Mass between the priest and the faithful (e.g., "The Lord be with you", "And with your spirit").

With the support of our musicians, I have decided during Advent to reintroduce our community to a small use of Latin in the Liturgy with the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God). Again, this was something encouraged by the Council, especially with the Ordinary parts of the Mass. Sacrosanctum Concilium stated: "...steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them" (SC, 54). (The works and music for these chants are on pages 308B and 313B in the Gather hymnal.)

In the end, there are several reasons to use Latin, even when we are unfamiliar with it, during Mass:

- It gives us continuity with our Catholic tradition and historical roots.
- It is the universal language of the Church and transcends linguistic and cultural barriers throughout the Church (like in India!).
- It is a sacred language that transcends time. Even though we may not know exactly the meaning of each word we are saying, we know all the different parts of the Mass by heart, and so Latin can help to lift us out of the immediate, temporal world and into the eternal realm of God as we sing with the angels and saints in one voice the hymn of unending praise: Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus, Holy, Holy.
- Finally, as mentioned above, it was one of the languages written on the inscription above Jesus on the cross!

Vivat Christus Rex! Long Live Christ the King!
