To the Lay Faithful of the Diocese of Baton Rouge:

The annual retreat for priests of the Diocese of Baton Rouge will be 02-05 February 2026 at St. Charles College at the Jesuit Retreat Center at Grand Coteau. These days of prayer and contemplation represent an important occasion for their renewal and growth in spiritual formation and well-being. As such, participation by our active priests is mandatory.

Thus, their temporary absence during this period of retreat will affect certain regular pastoral ministries. In particular, the schedule of weekday Masses and possible times for funeral Masses will be impacted and adjusted in your parish to meet needs of our priests during this time of renewal. While I recognize that this is a sacrifice, I consider this a sacrifice worth making. Deacons can provide needed funeral rites (the Wake Service, a Funeral without Mass, and the Rite of Committal). If the local parish staff is unable to secure a deacon for funeral needs, the parish staff may call the Office of the Vicar General by dialing 225.387.0561 for further assistance.

Thank you for understanding and supporting our priests with their ongoing formation and renewal for ministry! Please pray for our priests and our diocese during these days. I appreciate your affirmation and encouragement of our priests who give their lives for our diocese. May God be generous in leading us into a future filled with hope.

REFLECT

In *Evangelium vitae* (The Gospel of Life), Pope John Paul II applauds the daily heroism of mothers who selflessly devote themselves to their children. This modern-day saint also highlights the unfortunate reality that “these heroic women do not always find support in the world around them.” He goes on to say, “On the contrary, the cultural models frequently promoted and broadcast by the media do not encourage motherhood. In the name of progress and modernity the values of fidelity, chastity, sacrifice, to which a host of Christian wives and mothers have borne and continue to bear outstanding witness, are presented as obsolete” (EV 86).

A culture that fails to truly value motherhood naturally becomes hostile to the gift of new life. When the Church compassionately serves mothers, it witnesses to the beauty of human life. There is a great need for real, tangible assistance for expectant mothers. Christ calls us to serve those most alone and in need. In a world that often turns it back on mothers who sacrifice so much of themselves, may we, the Church’s members, rise to help mothers in need of assistance and support.

- Do you regularly enjoy a meal out during the week? Or do you typically stop to get a cup of coffee each morning? Give up one of these small pleasures this week. Use the money you saved to make a donation to a local pregnancy center, food pantry, or charity that provides assistance to mothers in need.

- Offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for the featured intention.

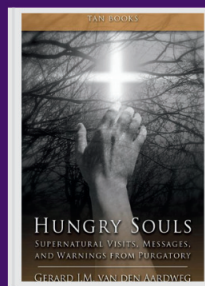
