SALT, LIGHT AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Every year on February 20th, the Church observes the **World Day of Social Justice**, which calls attention to the need for equality, inclusion, and respect for human rights. This focus aligns closely with the readings for the **Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**, when Jesus tells his disciples: *“You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world”* (Matthew 5:13–14). These images remind us that Christian faith is meant to shape society, especially where human dignity is threatened or ignored.

At the heart of **Catholic Social Teaching** is the belief that every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. Because of this, each person possesses an inherent dignity that cannot be earned, lost, or denied. This dignity belongs equally to the unborn child, the poor, the unemployed, the migrant, the elderly, and all who experience exclusion or discrimination. A just society is measured by how it treats its most vulnerable members.

The World Day of Social Justice highlights the responsibility of governments, institutions, and individuals to address poverty, unemployment, gender inequality, and violations of human rights. These are not merely political concerns; they are moral issues that affect real human lives. The First Reading from Isaiah makes this clear: *“Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless... Then your light shall break forth like the dawn”* (Isaiah 58:7–8). True love of God is inseparable from concern for those who are marginalized.

St. John Paul II emphasized that the defense of human life must be **consistent and inclusive**. Human life is sacred at every stage and in every condition. A society committed to justice protects the unborn while also confronting social injustices—such as poverty, racism, and lack of access to dignified work—that threaten life and dignity.

To be **salt and light** today means more than good intentions. It calls us to concrete action: accompanying the poor and marginalized, advocating for policies that protect life and human rights, and fostering parish communities where all are welcomed and valued. As Jesus reminds us, our good works are meant to shine—not for our glory, but so that others may *“give glory to your heavenly Father”* (Matthew 5:16).

Prayer:

God of justice and mercy, open our eyes to the dignity of every person and strengthen us to build a more just and inclusive world. Make us salt and light, so that your love may shine through us. Amen.
